Fundraising Up-date

In April 2017 our newsletter launched the Foodbank Development Plan that takes us forward with partners in the Welcome Network towards reducing or eliminating food poverty in our communities. At the same time we said that we needed to look at new ways to fund our costs to replace the initial development grants that we can no longer rely on.

Our running costs are at least £80k (eighty-thousand pounds) each year. Thanks to a Big Lottery Fund grant that the Welcome Network have been awarded they are able to contribute £20k (twenty-thousand pounds) each year towards our staff costs for the Ellesmere Port and Neston area. This is great news and a massive contribution.

We have reserve funds but we need to raise £60k (**sixty-thousand pounds**) each year to be able to meet our planned expenditure. Since April this year we have been more focused on fundraising and have raised £42k (forty-two thousand pounds) from the following:

- Eaton Hall Open Gardens (£20k)
- * Businesses (£10k)
- One-off donations (£9.5k)
- * Regular monthly standing order donations (£2.5k)

This is a brilliant effort but please remember that Eaton Hall was a timely one-off opportunity involving 100+ planning hours for our regular staff and volunteers and a superb effort from 150+ volunteers on the day.
